  - i. Laserglow signs and line projectors-also have vehicular attachments (side curtains for forklifts, etc.)



### 7. Best Practice/Meeting Roundtable

- Heat stress and rolling out heat stress alerts to a staff and lead hands. PPT and resources to explain what it is and symptoms.
  - Electrolyte based freezes handed out to everyone with heat coming in. Hydration and replenishing electrolytes. Staff looking out for each other and self monitor.
  - o <u>Heat Stress Toolkit OHCOW</u> new toolkit from OHCOW on Heat Stress.
- Dry spring but went wet quickly and bugs/black flies bad so animals coming out onto highways.
  - Insect bit recordable injury occurred last summer.
  - Warming habitats mean additional new insects/animals coming into new regions.



- People with hearing loss that have retired, report occupational illness to Ministry of Labour and see how they show up to respond to report.
  - Discussion around making sure you document and follow up on everything.
- Weigh scales being updated and if resulting in overweight fines for log hauling.
- An order received and asked that the company show the Ministry their risk assessment for the workplace.
  - Learnings from incident on a corrugator caught and had a crush injury, still off however doing better.
    - Had a couple learnings such as with jam be aware of the energy states and doing lockouts.
    - When identifying problems, include even rare ones. Also, develop procedures regardless, even if you don't think it would happen.
  - Established task and need to call for lockout leads or supervisor. Laminate and secure it to the machine.
  - Stop and think before you do anything. Assess the risks, no matter what you are doing. Culture needs to shift with this. Slow down.
  - Discussion on the number and format of signs and being careful with them. How ensure they read them?
- Sharing best practices and scenarios is advantage of being on this committee.
  - Human and machine interfaces
