1. Welcome and Safety Share

- Safety Alert Incident:
 - Incident Description: A worker was rolling up a cable on a highway.
 During the shift, a car caught the end of the cable, dragging the worker down the highway. The worker sustained a broken collarbone and road rash on his forehead and shoulder.
 - Safety Concerns: Concerns expressed about road workers not paying attention to their surroundings, which can lead to accidents.
 - Safety Measures: Emphasized the need for better safety measures on highway construction sites, including having barriers and ensuring workers are aware of their environment to prevent such incidents.
- Pressurized Lines Safety: Discussion on the importance of safety measures for
 pressurized lines, including proper installation, barricading, and ensuring that
 workers are aware of the hazards. They mentioned a past incident where an
 operator was injured due to a pressurized line not being secured properly.
 - Importance of Safety: Highlighted the critical importance of safety measures for pressurized lines, emphasizing proper installation and barricading to prevent accidents.
 - Past Incident: Recounted an incident where an operator was injured because a pressurized line was not secured properly. The line kicked up like a spiral, causing the operator to be hospitalized with shoulder injuries.
 - Preventive Measures: Discussed the need for ensuring that workers are aware of the hazards associated with pressurized lines and the importance of keeping people out of hazardous areas to prevent accidents.



- Mental Health and Worker Support: Highlight was shared on the ongoing efforts
 to support workers' mental health and reframing workers' mindsets. Also
 mentioned the importance of educating workers about the impact of mental
 health on their job performance.
 - Impact on Job Performance: Emphasized the importance of educating workers about how mental health affects their job performance and the need for ongoing support and education.
 - Worker Education: The efforts to educate workers on the importance of mental health and the impact it has on their work, including bringing in speakers to share personal stories and experiences.

4. Review of Action Items and Recommendations (Tracker)

- Promotion of Advisory Committee: Discussion on committee composition and recruitment were discussed.
 - Noted that Julia stepped down from the committee. Message was sent to Chair and WSN.
 - Meeting with WSN, Michael Ferguson, and Steve Wrixon will be booked for evaluation and shared for feedback and agreement with the committee before sending to Marketing and Communications team for promotion of open spots.
- Incident Reporting and Hazard Alerts: Discussion on the importance of incident reporting and hazard alerts. They mentioned the need for a more immediate hazard alert system and the involvement of the Ministry of Labour in generating smaller hazard alerts.



- Immediate Hazard Alerts: Emphasized the need for a more immediate hazard alert system to quickly inform workers and management about potential dangers.
- Current Practices: Participants discussed the current practices in incident reporting and the need for improvements to ensure timely and effective communication of hazards.
- Action: Steve Wrixon has been working with WSN and will be providing approximately 10 incidents that have occurred to start the building of the hazard alert resource.

6. WSN Update

- Marketing and Communications: Tiana shared a presentation.
- Supervisor Common Core Refresher:
 - Feedback was addressed on the Supervisor Common Core refresher course, noting that participants wanted more focus on legislative updates and new regulations. They acknowledged the need to revisit the learning objectives and incorporate more relevant content.
 - Feedback on Course: Acknowledged feedback from participants who wanted more focus on legislative updates and new regulations in the Supervisor Common Core refresher course.
 - Revisiting Learning Objectives: The need to revisit the learning objectives
 of the course to incorporate more relevant content and ensure it meets
 the needs of the participants.
 - Course Improvements: Tiana discussed potential improvements to the course, including adding more content on recent legislative changes and regulations to better prepare supervisors.



- Joint Health and Safety Committee Effectiveness: WSN offers a half-day course on Joint Health and Safety Committee effectiveness, which covers criteria for proper workplace inspections and effective committee meetings. They suggested that this course could be converted to an e-learning format for greater accessibility.
 - Course Offering: Highlighted the half-day course offered by WSN on Joint Health and Safety Committee effectiveness, which includes criteria for proper workplace inspections and effective committee meetings.
 - E-learning Format: Discussion around the course being converted to an e-learning format to make it more accessible to a wider audience.
- Occupational Hygiene Upskilling: Discussed the WSIB-funded project focused on occupational hygiene upskilling, which includes modules on silica dust, diesel fumes, noise, and other hazards. The project aims to support frontline personnel with ongoing hygiene monitoring and training.
 - Project Overview: WSN provided an overview of the WSIB-funded project focused on occupational hygiene upskilling, which includes modules on various hazards such as silica dust, diesel fumes, and noise.
 - Support for Frontline Personnel: Emphasized how the project aims to support frontline personnel with ongoing hygiene monitoring and training to ensure their safety and health.
 - Training Modules: The specific training modules included in the project, which cover important topics related to occupational hygiene and hazard management.

Events/Workshops:

WSN provided an overview of upcoming events and training sessions, including the Battery Electric symposium, ventilation workshop, and risk management training. They emphasized the importance of these events in enhancing workplace safety and knowledge.



- Battery Electric Symposium: Scheduled for September 11th at Laurentian University, which will focus on the safe operation of battery electric vehicles.
- Ventilation Workshop: Scheduled for September 2nd to 4th in Timmins,
 which will cover important topics related to mine ventilation and safety.
- o **Seismicity Workshop:** Scheduled for September 23rd to 25th in Timmins.

7. Health and Safety Information Exchange/Sector Update

Mental Health and Worker Support:

- Tiana introduced the "seven-day challenge" aimed at reframing worker mindsets.
- Stressed the importance of understanding how mental health affects job performance.
- Discussed ongoing education initiatives and speaker engagement.

Incident Reporting and Hazard Alerts:

- Highlighted need for a more immediate hazard alert system.
- Mentioned the role of the Ministry of Labour in issuing smaller, frequent alerts.
