



# Working Safely with Propane

Ensure your workers receive refresher training!

With the approach of the winter operating season, employers are reminded of the importance of ensuring workers are appropriately trained in Working Safely with Propane. This legislated training requirement is recognized by the Technical Standards and Safety Authority (TSSA) and must be renewed every three years.

The half-day training covers necessary information and practice for workers to safely connect, disconnect and activate propane torches, appliances and heaters with an approved rating under 400,000 BTU. A significant portion of the program involves practical, hands-on training. Workers will review the

hazards of propane gas and receive instruction in procedures necessary for working safely with it. Participants receive a certificate indicating they meet the requirements set by the TSSA; certification expires after three years.

Participants must bring CSA-certified hard hat and safety boots; and wear long sleeves and long pants.
